Robert W. Ramsdell, 83, of Niantic, beloved husband of Betty Bahrman Ramsdell, passed away at Lawrence & Memorial Hospital on Friday November 30, 2007. He was born in New Britain on June 17, 1924 and was son of the late Fred and Emily Kieffer Ramsdell. A graduate of New Britain High School, he served with the U.S. Navy in the South Pacific during World War II and later graduated from Hillyer College, now the University of Hartford.
