Robert Welz, 69, of Kensington, husband of Carol Bugay Welz, passed away Thursday May 22, 2008 at the Hospital of Central Connecticut in New Britain. A New Britain native, he lived in Kensington since 1950. Bob was a graduate of Berlin High School, Class of 1956, and was employed at Liberty Industries in Berlin for 30 years, retiring in 2005. A member of the Kensington Congregational Church, he was active with the church food booth at the Berlin Fair for 20 years. An avid reader and fisherman, he served on the board of directors at the Berlin Free Library and worked part-time there for 7 years.
