Ronald J. Dube, 49, of Wethersfield, died peacefully in his sleep Saturday January 20, 2007 at his home. Born in New Britain, son of Angela Cote Dube of Wethersfield and the late Joseph Armand Dube, he was a former Cromwell and Unionville resident until moving to Wethersfield in 1988. A graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1976, Ron worked for ABC Tools of New Britain until he became a General Contractor doing roofing and siding when he had his accident July 23, 1977. Sispite his disabilities Ron managed to keep going. He got into computers, photography and attended Manchester Community College where he did commercials and ads.
