



Ruby Bomba Fuller

April 26, 1917 - February 15, 2008

Ruby Bomba Fuller, of Kensington, passed away Friday February 15, 2008 with her husband John B. Fuller at her side at the William Childs Hospice in Palm Bay Florida after a long illness. She was born April 26, 1917 in New Britain, daughter of Frederick LeRoy Bacon and Florence Weatherel Bacon, and lived in the Berlin/Kensington area since 1951.

Ruby was married to the late J. William Bomba until his death in 1979. She married John B. Fuller of Kensington in 1981 and gained three step children whom she loved dearly; Dr. J. Barden Fuller and his wife Kathy and grandchildren Brian and Megan of Southington; Russell Pound Fuller and his wife Rhona of Southington and granddaughters Kimberly Ciemiewski of Newington and Kristina Guzzardi of East Berlin; Nancy Fuller Clemmons and husband Edward Clemmons and her daughters Tanya and Corena Bristow, all of North Carolina. Ruby also leaves a niece, Joan Bacon Wheeler of Bristol and a nephew Robert Bacon of New Hampshire. She was predeceased by her brother Frederick LeRoy Bacon, Jr.

Ruby had a full life with many interests; the South Church and its Women's Association, Study & Service, Mr. & Mrs. Club Past President, deacons and Sr. Deacons and chaired the Greeters Group. She served as representative to the Central Association-UCC for South Church. She was also a member of the Berlin Players, directing many of their plays at the old Town Hall. One of

her claims to fame was directing Peter Falk in his early years before he went professional. She was also active in the Berlin Garden Club, winning many prizes for her arrangements and the New Britain Women's Club.

For twenty years with her husband John, they traveled much of North America until her illness took over in 2001. She visited 45 states, 7 Canadian Provinces and two states in Mexico. Ruby served the Wally Bynan Caravan Club International as First Lady of the Cape Cod Unit and Corresponding Secretary for Region 1 of WBCCI.

Funeral services are Thursday 1 PM in the Erwin Chapel of South Church, 90 Main Street, New Britain, followed by a reception. Interment will follow in Fairview Cemetery.
