Rudolph "Rudy" Hartz, 89, of Glastonbury, husband of Mary (Marek) Hartz and widower of his first wife Doris (Bowry) Hartz, passed away Saturday (February 4, 2017) at Manchester Manor. Born in New Britain, Rudy was a former Farmington and Wethersfield resident moving to Glastonbury in 2001.
