Russell F. Hallin, 94, of Newington, died Wednesday April 20, 2005 at Maplevue Manor in Rocky Hill. He was the widower of Avis Samuelson Hallin, who died in 1993. A native and longtime New Britain resident, Russell lived in Newington for 6 years, Daytona Beach, FL from 1994 to 2002, before returning to Newington. A graduate of New Britain High School, Class of 1929, he was head teller at New Britain National Bank until 1942 and worked in the accounting department at Fafnir Bearing Company for 33 years, retiring in 1975. He also worked at the former Plainville Stadium for 20 years with his two sons. Russell was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church; was Past Noble Grand of Andree Lodge #47, Independent Order of Odd Fellows; was former Treasurer of the Vega Society of New Britain and was a charter member of the Svea Social Club.

Surviving are two sons, Donald Hallin and his wife Deborah of Plainville; and Rodney Hallin and his wife Danielle of East Hapmton; four grandchildren, Marc Hallin and his fiancée Jessica Lockery of Plainville; Catherine Michaud and her husband Chris of Forestville; Michelle Scalera and her husband Robert of Hackettstown, NJ; and Ryan Hallin and his wife Cynthia of Hebron; as well as 10 great grandchildren.

Funeral services are Saturday 11 AM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery.
