Stanley J. Pajor, Jr, 61, of Berlin, died Monday March 17, 2003 at New Britain General Hospital. Born in Hartford, son of the late Stanley J. Pajor, Sr. who passed away in August of 2002, and Florence Anulewicz, he has been a lifelong Berlin resident and attended Berlin High School. Stanley was employed as a foreman for Tilcon for 25 years, until his retirement in 1996. He was also a volunteer for the Kensington Fire Department and drove ambulances for them.
