



## Thomas McCoullough Marshall

December 12, 1941 - April 12, 2007

Thomas McCoullough Marshall, 65, of Kensington, husband of Constance Bliss Marshall, died Thursday April 12, 2007 at his home. Born in Hartford, Tom was a Newington resident for ten years until moving to Kensington in 1972. He served in active duty for the National Guard in the 1960's and 70's. A graduate of Columbia Law School, Tom was a founding member and partner of the Law Office of Weber and Marshall for 20 years in New Britain. He was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Britain; was president of the school board in Berlin from 1975 to 1979; and was active in democratic politics.

Besides his wife Constance, he is survived by two sons, John Marshall of Kensington, and Timothy Marshall and his wife Anya of South Africa; and a granddaughter, Sophia Marshall. He was predeceased by his parents, Leroy and Katherine McCoullough Marshall; and an aunt, Louise McCoullough.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday April 18 11 AM at St. Mark's Episcopal Church, 147 West Main Street, New Britain. Calling hours will be held Tuesday evening 5 to 8 PM at Carlson Funeral Home, 45 Franklin Square, New Britain.
