Thomas Salvatore Pedemonti, 91, passed peacefully to heaven from his home in Farmington on Tuesday April 28, 2026. He was born on November 26, 1934, the son of John and Elia (Molta) Pedemonti. He was predeceased by his first wife Nina, second wife June, sister-in-law Susan Pedemonti, niece Amy Pedemonti and stepson Russell Holcomb.

Thomas grew up in Kensington where he was a boy scout, an altar boy under Monsignor Thomas Greylish, and a graduate of E.C Goodwin Tech in New Britain. He served in the U.S. Army from 1957 to 1959. He is a 3rd degree Knight with the Knights of Columbus, a lifelong member of the Italian Independent Political Club of Kensington, and a former corporator of the Berlin Savings Bank.

He and his brother Richard were the owners of Town and Country Furniture and Gifts in Kensington from 1960 to 2003, which was a staple in town.

Thomas and Richard also built their custom colonials on Beckley Road in the mid 1960's.

He enjoyed winters in Florida, summers in Vermont, fishing, traveling, weekends at Lime Rock Park, watching his NY Yankees and all gatherings with family and friends.
