



## Violet Zavarella Montalbano

May 18, 1916 - June 1, 2003

Violet Zavarella Montalbano, 87, of New Britain, died Sunday June 1, 2003 at New Britain General Hospital. She was the widow of Salvatore Montalbano, who died in 1997. Born in Pratola, Italy, she has been a New Britain resident since 1930. Violet worked at the former Landers, Frary & Clark Company, and later at General Electric in Plainville, retiring in 1987.
