William "Bill" Kalwat, 82, of Plainville, husband of Bonnie (Sandquist) Kalwat, passed away Wednesday (July 28) at Apple Rehab of the Farmington Valley in Plainville. Born in New Britain, son of the late Edward and Martha (Teffs) Kalwat, he lived in Plainville for the past 48 years. A graduate of New Britain High School, class of 1957, Bill served with the US Army during the Vietnam Conflict. He was a case administrator at Aetna in Hartford for 25 years, retiring in 1990. Bill was a member of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in New Britain and was an avid Boston Red Sox fan. Bill and Bonnie spent 37 years vacationing in Aruba, an island that truly held a special place in his heart.
